Introduction:

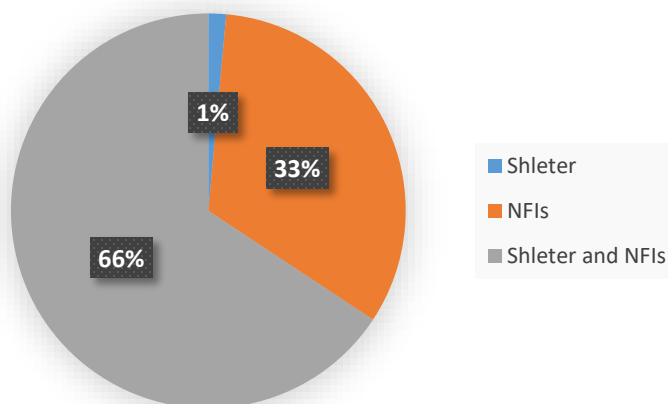
According to ExU and SNFIs' recommendations there are IDPs in Mawza, Al-Mudhaffer, Al-Misrakh and Al-Ma'affer's sites in emergency needing to Shelter and NFIs assistance, in coordination between YCO and ExU the FGD and KII made in targeted sites to collect data by using SNFIs cluster approved form.

The total HHs need NFIs only are 249, HHs need Shelter only are 11, HHs need both kits of Shelter and NFIs are 498, the chart below clarify the needing in percentage.

The result of assessment showed us there is a gap of needing for 758 HHs 3846 individual the table divided the 758 based on the sites had assessed:

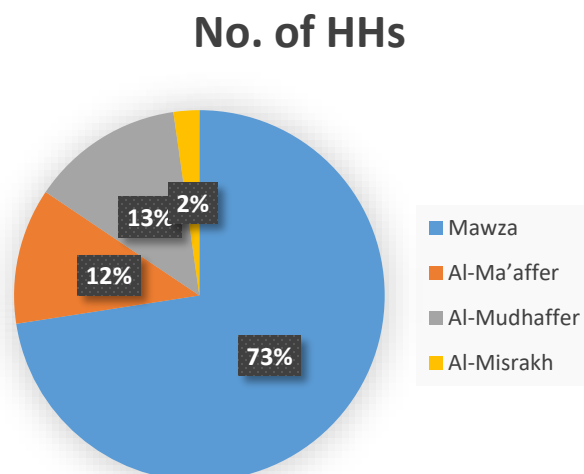

Objectives:

The Focus Group discussions and Key Informant Interviews were under taken to discuss with the IDPs camps on the following:

- To identify the SNFI needs.
- To cover the IDPs needs for NFIs and ESKs.

Methodology:

The methodology used in identification NFI needs was:

- Focus Group Discussions with IDPs.
- Interviews with Local authorities and community leaders.
- Direct observation of the living situation of IDPs.

Five Focus group discussions by coordinating with ExUs' supervisors and representatives of IDPs, one hundred and seventy-four (112 males and 62 females) of hosts and IDPs attend the discussions,

Key Findings:

Firstly Mawza' district:

The assessment including all Mawzas' sites and showed the result below:

- 1- Eighty-two percent of IDPs in crucial situation they need to full shelter and NFIs kits.
- 2- Four percent could not carry any items from his origin, 78.2% the last assistance they had received in June 2020.

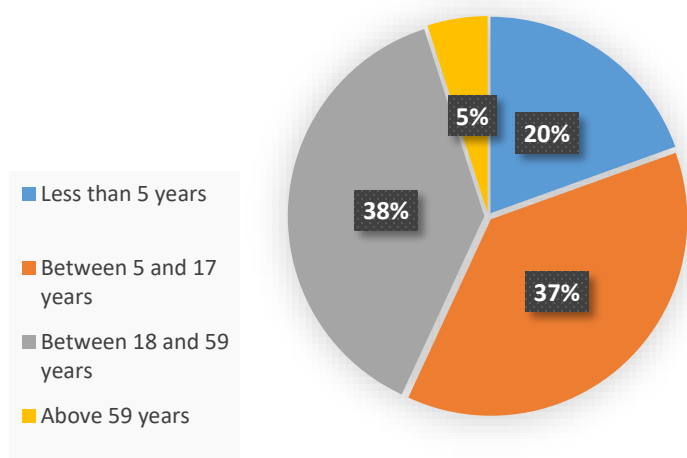
- 3- IDPs could not back to their origin due to conflict as those areas became in fire line, war area or they have no place to back with losing of their livelihoods. the table below illustrate the arrival areas:

- 4- The last assistance were from IOM and SI.
- 5- Most of IDPs moved between Ta'izzs' districts or in sites of same district, Mawza have 371 HHs had displaced internal especially Al-Awashiqah sub district.
- 6- The IDP who lives in temporary shelter lives in poor quality shelter made of plastic sheets or rest of material they gathered from trash, they need to shelter that give them privacy and security.
- 7- The statistics of age differences clarify there is a rapprochement in population from 5 years to 59 years as the chart below illustrate:

Secondly Al-Ma'affer, Al-Misrakh and Al-Mudhaffer district:

By surveying Al-Naql and Al-Manasheer sites in Al-Mudhaffer district, Markez Al-Mudiriah, Naged Qussim and Al-Dohrah sites in Al-Misrakh, Naqeel Al-Meesar, Qahfat Arafah and Al-Khorah sites in Al-Ma'affer district the result being as the points following:

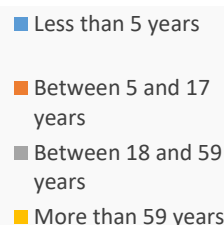
- 1- Most of IDPs has not received any assistance since their displaced and the rest are new.
- 2- Eighty-nine percent of displacement is internally (from Ta'izzs' districts to another)

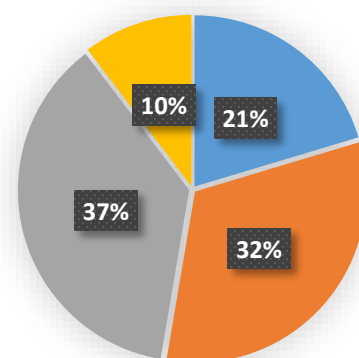

The IDPs in Al-Misrakh and Al-Mudhaffer are equal 118 coming from Taizz, Al-Hudaodah, Lahj, Ibb, Hajah and Sana'a governorates.

1. Rapid access to IDPs to cover the gap in shelter and NFIs needing.
2. High coordination with ExU and SNFIs cluster to move to second phase to respond to IDPs.
3. Request from emergency pipeline stock.
